Public events of Curators' Network Budapest include presentations and a portfolio-exhibition. The international curators and some local initiatives present their projects, institutions and curatorial practices on the 11th (Thursday) and 12th (Friday) October 2012 in the Ludwig Museum. Before and during the presentations (15.00 - 20.00) the portfolio-exhibition with the works of the participating artists will also be open to the public.

## tinker / globally / act / locally

Presentations will revolve around the rhythm of self-organisation and the relations between marginality and power, alternative models in cultural production, the tension between the individual and the organisation in curatorial processes. We will hear about an output of a project in terms of 'glocality' and by the end of the series of presentations we may be able to answer the question: 'is going global actually a good way to escape from the local misery?'

Sessions will focus on different standpoints on curating, exhibition making and ways of institutional development. Several presentations will deal with educational means and models and progressive activities at European art universities; we will hear about a brand new residency program in Vienna and we'll hopefully pocket the key of how not to die of boredom and struggle.

Between 15:00 and 20:00 the **portfolio-exhibition** will be open to the public on 11<sup>th</sup> (Thursday) and 12<sup>th</sup> (Friday) October. Presentations will start at 17.00

17: 15 – 17:30 Fatoş Üstek (TR) | Independent curator and art critic based in London, United Kingdom

**Visionary than Critical** | Fatoş Üstek will introduce *Vision Forum*, a module for supporting artistic research and production in collaboration with Linkopings Universitet, Sweden. *Vision Forum*, currently supports 15 international projects worldwide with 60 international members who are formed of artists, curators, writers and scientists. Alongside her affiliation of initiating and leading *Vision Forum* projects in London, she will be talking about OuUnPo and La Duree.

Outsiders entering the contemporary art field | The presentation of (contemporary) fine art has certain well known and maybe outdated rules that are excepted in the mainstream and commercial art field but seem to work differently outside that context. How could these two inform and inspire each other? In her presentation Maaike Gouwenberg would like to share her ideas about exhibition making and show a few examples where artists and curators take these other forms as influence and inspiration for their presentation and research.

Andrea Löbel will introduce Kunsthalle Exnergasse in detail with curatorial projects and the association behind the cultural centre WUK Werkstätten- und Kulturhaus in general, including the brand new residency programme starting in 2012 and the exhibition programme for 2013.

Luigi Fassi will focus on some of the recent shows he curated at ar/ge kunst in Bolzano.

19:00 – 19:15 Søren Grammel (DE) | Director of Koelnischer Kunstverein, Cologne, Germany

**Thinking with space and material** | Curatorial form is nothing total. It is not committed to the identity of thought and object, but rather operates with the awareness that truth is something

artificial and temporary. Exhibitions are imaginary sites, short-time gatherings of disparate actors and ideas. They are forms that emphasize the synthetic nature of all concepts. In this sense I try to critically relocate the ideology of staging and its relationship with mediation throughout my work instead of abandoning it. The display in my projects is not orientated towards solving conflicts between works and audiences and artists and me, but rather to focusing them. For me this is a chance to question, alter and experiment with ideas and concepts instead of 'saying something'. Curatorial practice ideally creates unstable constellations contradicting the notion of knowledge (truth) as something accomplished. By inventing new movements and operations, curatorial projects can involve with, displace, outmaneuver, and sometimes change the institutional dispositives within which they maneuver.

19:15 – 19:30 Jürgen Tabor (AT) | Deputy director and curator of the Galerie im Taxispalais in Innsbruck, Austria

In his presentation, Jürgen Tabor focuses on his experiences with curating the group exhibition "Past Desire" (Galerie im Taxispalais, 2011) which comprised ten artists from eight different countries. Taking the exhibition as an example, he reflects on the concept, realisation and output (or failure) of the project in terms of glocality.

**Programming the institution. The recognition and quality of its programme largely depends on the gallery's artistic directors, who determine the concept behind the exhibition programme and curatorial positioning of the individual projects.

Shifting authorities | The curatorial practice of Estelle Nabeyrat has grown through different interests and topics influenced in the last years by social sciences. As much as possible, her projects take into consideration the context and how a discursive space develops in its relation to the content. For her, an exhibition is never considered an authority.

Fatima Hellberg's talk will concentrate on her own interest in self-organisation and the tension between the individual and the organisation in curatorial processes. She will particularly draw on Barthes' lecture, *How to Live Together* in which he explores rhythms of self-organisation and the relations between marginality and power.

**Creating institutions as a research project.** *How not to die of boredom and struggle?* | F.A.I.T. will serve as an example for Gaweł Kownacki to compare three forms of art organisations and ways of development (off space, commercial gallery, project space&bar).

**Researching Korea** | Within Korean contemporary thinking, the cultural need of localization is being replaced by an in-depth exploration and translation of tradition, closely connected by recognition and representation. A huge development of the alternative models in cultural production and cultural presentation is registered. Alternating between flexible and nomadic, these models integrate subjects connected to visual desire, technology, identity, and originality.

Zé dos Bois celebrates its 18th anniversary in October 2012. In his talk, Natxo Checa will focus on the profile of the institution through presenting the most memorable projects in the history of ZDB.

In his presentation János Szoboszlai will introduce the Program in Fine Art Theory at the Hungarian University of Fine Arts launched in the academic year 2009/2010. The aim of the BA program in Art Theory and subsequent MA programs in Art Theory and Art Management is to provide training for

the future "operators" of the art world in parallel with art education. The objective of the BA in Art Theory is to coordinate theoretical studies in relation to curatorial practice in the form of an up-to-date educational program which provides a marketable degree and which keeps abreast of the latest results of art theory research. In addition to the theoretical aspects of curatorial studies, there is also strong emphasis on its practical components (exhibition-making, editing of publications, PR, project financing, submitting applications for funding, organising international programs).

How we tinkered a school | In his presentation Jiří Ptáček will focus on the activites at Faculty of Fine Arts in Brno and the initiation of a fictive studio "Ateliér Бања Лука" in which young art students, pedagogues and curators are aiming to open different perspectives of learning/teaching and collective art practice.
